## WCVI Launches 2022 Eco Intern Class

Group of distinguished students will participate in WCVI's 12th Class of Eco Interns

(LOS ANGELES) – William C. Velasquez Institute (WCVI) today launched the 2022 Session of the Eco Interns Program to celebrate Earth Day!

The 2022 class of the Eco Interns will see distinguished youth from Alliance High School, Los Angeles Leadership Academy, Roosevelt High School, West Adams Preparatory High School and Wilson High School participate in a three-month program hosted by William C. Velasquez Institute. The program's focus is to train and prepare a cohort of Latino high school students who care about mitigating climate change and can learn from experts about how they can be the future vanguards of the planet.

WCVI started the program over twelve years ago, understanding the work executed around LA River revitalization and climate justice must include preparing them for their role as future leaders of our urban neighborhoods. The Eco Intern program was initiated by the late Antonio González.

During this internship, students will learn about our region's watershed health and quality, stormwater capture and reuse, wildlife conservation, LA River history, open space, community efforts to curb pollution, environmental activism/communications, and green jobs.

**WCVI President Lydia Camarillo**, said "WCVI is proud to host these talented Latino students and connect them to experts who will nurture and inspire their connection to the planet. With each Eco Intern session, we've been so inspired by the intellect, commitment and dedication these students have for their future as environmental stewards".
