That is 3.2 Million Latino voters who are eligible to vote and have not yet registered to vote


The Median Age of the Latino Voter is 22 years old!




CALIFORNIA 1996 TO 2020




CALIFORNIA LATINO VOTE MIDTERM GENERAL ELECTIONS 1982-2018 IN MILLIONS








TEXAS LATINO VOTE IN MILLIONS 1996 TO 2020
















California and Texas Latino Vote Comparison Midterm General Elections 1982 to 2018






MALDEF represents the groups that sued Texas
